History

- **1915:** Founded by the Sisters of Loretto, the college was the first 4-year Catholic women's college west of the Mississippi River
- **1962:** Became coeducational
- **1967:** Sisters of Loretto voted to transfer leadership to a lay board of directors
- **1972:** Opened first extended campus in Kansas City, Mo.
- **1974:** Opened first military campus in Ft. Sheridan, Ill.
- **1978:** Opened first European campus in Geneva
- **1983:** Became a University
- **1988:** Initiated doctoral degree in management
- **1996:** Opened first Asian campus in Shanghai
- **1999:** Offered first complete MBA program online
- **2001:** Acquired St. Louis Symphony Community Music School
- **2006:** Downtown St. Louis campus relocated to the historic Old Post Office
- **2007:** Ambassador and Mrs. George H. Walker, III donated the largest gift in school history
- **2008:** Opened Missouri's only Confucius Institute
- **2011:** Webster Works campaign closed, surpassing \$55 million goal
- **2012:** 94,323 square-foot East Academic Building opened on home campus
